

FAITH – C. Faifer’s Notes

Rom 10:17 So then faith *cometh* by **hearing**, and hearing by the **word of Yah**.

1. Knowing what Yah has said He WILL DO
2. Believing Yah WILL DO what he has promised
3. Expecting Yah TO DO what He has promised to do

Eph 6:10 Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might.

Eph 6:11 Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.

Eph 6:12 For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high *places*.

Eph 6:13 Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand.

Eph 6:14 Stand therefore, having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness;

Eph 6:15 And your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace;

Eph 6:16 Above all, taking the shield of faith, wherewith ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked.

Eph 6:17 And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God:

Eph 6:18 Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints.

By Faith

Heb 11:1 Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.

Heb 11:2 For **by it** the elders obtained a good report.

Heb 11:3 **Through faith** we understand that the worlds were framed by the **word of Yah**, so that things which are seen were not made of things which do appear.

Heb 11:4 **By faith** Abel offered unto **Yah** a more excellent sacrifice than Cain, **by which** he obtained witness that he was righteous, **Yah** testifying of his gifts: and by it he being dead yet speaketh.

Heb 11:5 **By faith** Enoch was translated that he should not see death; and was not found, because **Yah** had translated him: for before his translation he had this testimony, that he pleased God.

Heb 11:6 But without faith *it is* impossible to please *him*: for he that cometh to Yah must believe that he is, and *that* he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

Heb 11:7 **By faith** Noah, being warned of **Yah** of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house; by the which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is by faith.

Heb 11:8 **By faith** Abraham, when he was called to go out into a place which he should after receive for an inheritance, **obeyed; and he went out, not knowing whither he went.**

Heb 11:9 **By faith** he sojourned in the land of promise, as *in* a strange country, dwelling in tabernacles with Isaac and Jacob, the heirs with him of the same promise:

Heb 11:10 For he looked for a city which hath foundations, whose builder and maker *is* **Yah**.

Heb 11:11 **Through faith** also Sara herself received strength to conceive seed, and was delivered of a child when she was past age, **because she judged him faithful who had promised.**

Heb 11:12 Therefore sprang there even of one, and him as good as dead, *so many* as the stars of the sky in multitude, and as the

sand which is by the sea shore innumerable.

Heb 11:13 These all died in faith, not having received the promises, but having seen them afar off, and were persuaded of *them*, and embraced *them*, and confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth.

Heb 11:14 For they that say such things declare plainly that they seek a country.

Heb 11:15 And truly, if they had been mindful of that *country* from whence they came out, they might have had opportunity to have returned.

Heb 11:16 But now they desire a better *country*, that is, an heavenly: wherefore **Yah** is not ashamed to be called their **Yah**: for he hath prepared for them a city.

Heb 11:17 **By faith** Abraham, when he was tried, offered up Isaac: and he that had received the promises offered up his only begotten *son*,

Heb 11:18 Of whom it was said, That in Isaac shall thy seed be called:

Heb 11:19 Accounting that **Yah** was able to raise *him* up, even from the dead; from whence also he received him in a figure.

Heb 11:20 **By faith** Isaac blessed Jacob and Esau concerning things to come.

Heb 11:21 **By faith** Jacob, when he was a dying, blessed both the sons of Joseph; and worshipped, *leaning* upon the top of his staff.

Heb 11:22 **By faith** Joseph, when he died, made mention of the departing of the children of Israel; and gave commandment concerning his bones.

Heb 11:23 **By faith** Moses, when he was born, was hid three months of his parents, because they saw *he was* a proper child; and they were not afraid of the king's commandment.

Heb 11:24 **By faith** Moses, when he was come to years, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter;

Heb 11:25 Choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season;

Heb 11:26 Esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt: for he had respect unto the recompence of the reward.

Heb 11:27 **By faith** he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king: for he endured, as seeing him who is invisible.

Heb 11:28 **Through faith** he kept the passover, and the sprinkling of blood, lest he that destroyed the firstborn should touch them.

Heb 11:29 **By faith** they passed through the Red sea as by dry *land*: which the Egyptians assaying to do were drowned.

Heb 11:30 **By faith** the walls of Jericho fell down, after they were compassed about seven days.

Heb 11:31 **By faith** the harlot Rahab perished not with them that believed not, when she had received the spies with peace.

Heb 11:32 And what shall I more say? for the time would fail me to tell of **Gedeon**, and of **Barak**, and of **Samson**, and of **Jephthae**; of **David** also, and **Samuel**, and of the **prophets**:

Heb 11:33 Who **through faith** subdued kingdoms, wrought righteousness, obtained promises, **stopped** the mouths of lions,

Heb 11:34 **Quenched** the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong, waxed valiant in fight, turned to flight the armies of the aliens.

Heb 11:35 **Women** received their dead raised to life again: and **others** were tortured, not accepting deliverance; that they might obtain a better resurrection:

Heb 11:36 And **others** had trial of *cruel* mockings and scourgings, yea, moreover of bonds and imprisonment:

Heb 11:37 They were **stoned**, they were **sawn asunder**, were **tempted**, were **slain** with the sword: they **wandered** about in

sheepskins and goatskins; being **destitute, afflicted, tormented**. See 2 Cor.1:3-11

2Co 1:3 Blessed *be* God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies, and the God of all comfort;

2Co 1:4 Who comforteth us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God.

2Co 1:5 For as the sufferings of Christ abound in us, so our consolation also aboundeth by Christ.

2Co 1:6 And whether we be afflicted, *it is* for your consolation and salvation, which is effectual in the enduring of the same sufferings which we also suffer: or whether we be comforted, *it is* for your consolation and salvation.

2Co 1:7 And our hope of you *is* steadfast, knowing, that as ye are partakers of the sufferings, so *shall ye be* also of the consolation.

2Co 1:8 For we would not, brethren, have you ignorant of our trouble which came to us in Asia, that we were pressed out of measure, above strength, insomuch that we despaired even of life:

2Co 1:9 But we had the sentence of death in ourselves, that we should not trust in ourselves, but in God which raiseth the dead:

2Co 1:10 Who delivered us from so great a death, and doth deliver: in whom we trust that he will yet deliver *us*;

2Co 1:11 Ye also helping together by prayer for us, that for the gift *bestowed* upon us by the means of many persons thanks may be given by many on our behalf.

Heb 11:38 (Of whom the world was not worthy:) they wandered in deserts, and *in* mountains, and *in* dens and caves of the earth.

Heb 11:39 And these all, **having obtained a good report through faith**, received not the promise:

Heb 11:40 God having provided some better thing for us, that they without us should not be made perfect.

Isa 26:2 Open ye the gates, that the righteous nation which keepeth the truth may enter in.

Isa 26:3 Thou wilt keep *him* in perfect peace, *whose mind is stayed on thee:* because he trusteth in thee.
